Abstracts should be of minimum 300 words. Presentations should not be longer than 20 minutes. The authors of accepted papers will be notified by February 15<sup>th</sup>, 2020. Conference participants cover travel and accommodation costs (information on accommodation in Toruń and booking options at the NCU University Hotel at preferential rates will be available).

The organizers plan to publish conference proceedings as a monograph. Details will be given to participants at the conference. Papers can be delivered in Polish, English, Turkish and Russian.
